FINANCIAL ANALYSIS:

For the current financial year, Clinigene incurred a profit of Rs. 23.7 Million as against a profit of Rs. 7.8 Million in the previous year. The Company registered revenue of Rs. 227.2 million as against Rs. 115.5 million in the previous year.

DIRECTORS:

Mrs. Kiran Mazumdar Shaw retires by rotation at the ensuing Annual General Meeting and being eligible, offers herself for re-election. Shareholders approval is sought for her appointment as Director of the Company.

AUDITORS:

The Statutory Auditors M/s S.R. Batliboi & Associates, Chartered Accountants, Bangalore, retire at the ensuing Annual General Meeting and are eligible for re-appointment.

In the report by the Auditors under Companies (Auditors' Report) Order, 2003 (as Amended), the Auditors have reported that company has maintained proper records showing full particulars, including quantitative details of fixed assets in Fixed Asset Register

The Auditors have also reported that the company has generally deposited Service Tax with the appropriate authorities except for Rs. 58,43,393/- relating to a demand received from the on certain export services rendered by the Company. The Company is of the view that the services are exempt service and hence the said tax is not currently payable.

FIXED DEPOSITS:

The Company has not accepted any fixed deposits and, as such, no principal or interest was outstanding on the date of the balance sheet.

A state of the art Human Pharmacology Unit has been set up to conduct Phase I, Bioequivalence and Bioavailability studies. The Company is also endeavouring to identify new biomarkers in the area of Diabetics and Oncology.

The Company is committed to energy conservation and adheres to international standards in terms of hygiene, health, safety, environment, and pollution control.

The Company has not bought any technology for absorption.
